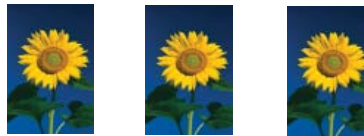

The 80th Legislative Session is shaping up to be another important session dealing with a host of water and wastewater issues. In this regard, Mr. Embrey will discuss pending legislation related to water utility and water quality matters, and provide insight regarding expected changes in the law related to these issues.

Ty H. Embrey is a member of Lloyd Gosselink’s Water Practice Group and Governmental Relations Practice Group and his practice focuses on water law, environmental and legislative matters. Ty received his Doctor of Jurisprudence from Baylor Law School and his Bachelor of Arts from the University of Texas at Austin. Ty served as General Counsel to the Texas Senate Natural Resources Committee. He served as lead staff for the Oil-Field Cleanup Fund Advisory Committee and General Counsel for the Texas Senate Water Advisory Council and the Joint Senate and House Committee on Water Resources. He also served as General Counsel to Senator J.E. “Buster” Brown and Legislative Aide to State Representative Beverly Woolley. Ty is a member of the State Bar of Texas (Environmental and Natural Resources Section), the Austin Bar Association (Environmental Natural Resources and Water Law Section) and the Austin Young Lawyers Association.
