As the population continues to grow in central Texas, demands on existing water and wastewater infrastructure continue to increase. In order to keep up with this demand, Utility providers have been challenged with expanding their existing treatment facilities and supporting infrastructure. With this in mind, Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) will present their current construction project to expand the treatment capacity of Brushy Creek Wastewater Treatment plant from 11.8 to 21.5 million gallons per day. Technologies incorporated into the plant treatment process will be discussed including energy saving equipment. The primary customers served by Brushy Creek Wastewater Plant are the Cities of Round Rock, Cedar Park, and Austin; and Brushy Creek and Fern Bluff Municipal Utility Districts.

Monica Pfeifer, PE, PMP is a Sr. Project Manager for the LCRA. She received a Bachelor of Science in Agricultural Engineering from Texas A&M University. She is a registered Professional Engineer and Project Management Professional. She has been with LCRA for approximately 10 years, and has spent her career in the water and wastewater utility. She began her work in water and wastewater operations, and then moved into engineering and construction. Presently, she is working on water and wastewater utility projects in Travis and Williamson Counties.
