New Spill Reporting Rule – Knowing When and How to Use It

The 84th Texas Legislature passed SB 912 relating to reporting requirements for spills of 1000 gallons or less. This new law initiated a rule writing process at the TCEQ with the new reporting standard becoming effective June 2, 2016. Knowing how and when to use the new rule is essential for utilities and subscriber facilities to realize its benefits.

This webinar will give attendees a primer on the new rule, when to use it, how to use the monthly cumulative reporting sheet, and the accepted forms of spill calculation. As stated in statute, a 1000 gallon or less spill must meet a number of other criteria to be considered eligible for the new reporting standard. Attendees will be given an easy breakdown of the criteria as well as quick tutorial on the elements required on the one page reporting form. Webinar attendees will also be instructed on the approved methods for spill calculation.
