Utility Membership Application

The Water Environment Association of Texas (WEAT) recently developed a Utility Membership. With the continual push for utilities to achieve more with fewer resources, it is often difficult for utility employees to have membership dues reimbursed. Additionally, many utilities limit the number of staff who are reimbursed for professional organization memberships. WEAT intends to provide a Utility Membership that will allow utilities to budget adequately for WEF and WEAT memberships and further enable utility staff to take advantage of the many benefits of WEF and WEAT.

Utility Membership will provide one prime benefit over the conventional memberships. ALL employees of the member utility will be able to register at all *WEAT* meetings, conferences, seminars and workshops at the lower member rate. Additionally, the Utility Membership dues structure provides discounts over separately purchased memberships, and utilities may purchase additional memberships at a reduced rate. However, WEF member benefits only apply to the individuals listed in the application.

Utilities will select their category based on their combined permitted wastewater flow for their wastewater facilities, as shown in Table 1. Utilities with a permitted flow of less than 10 mgd may select from 2 categories, giving them the option to include an active membership rather than only PWO memberships.

After the utility selects which category they fit into, they determine who shall receive each of the individual memberships shown in the right column of Table 1. The application has two parts. Part A is for the general utility information. Each individual member must complete a separate Part B.

Example

Utility has one facility with a permitted flow capacity of 5 mgd. From Table 1, they are in the E or F category. This entitles the facility to select from 4 Professional Wastewater Operations (PWO) memberships or 1 Active and 3 PWO memberships. They must complete Part A of the application. Next, select who will receive the 4 individual members and have them complete Part B of the application individually.

Membership Types

PWO (Professional Wastewater Operator)

For individuals working on a day-to-day basis in a wastewater collection, treatment or laboratory facility. The publications included with this membership include WE&T (including Operations Forum) or Water Environment Research, WEF Highlights, and Texas WET.

Active

For individuals involved in engineering, administrative, regulatory agencies, manufacturing, manufacture representatives, and those engaged in the management, supervision of wastewater collection and treatment facilities. An active member is also a member of WEF and an eligible voting member with all the rights and privileges granted. The publications included with this membership include WE&T (including Operations Forum) or Water Environment Research, WEF Highlights, and Texas WET.

Executive

Receives all the rights and privileges of an Active member and receives the following additional publications: WEF Industrial Wastewater, Regulation Watch, Biosolids Technical Bulletin, Watershed & Wet Weather Technical Bulletin, Utility Executive, and Laboratory Solutions.
