2006-028-090-AD	<p>Environmental Management Systems This rulemaking would make changes to the EMS approval process, further harmonize the rules with statutory language, and incorporate other management changes to the Clean Texas program.</p>
2006-001-060-CE	<p>Compliance History Revision of the current compliance history rule as a result of the enforcement review process</p>
2005-029-070-CE	<p>Penalty Payments This rulemaking amends provisions relating to ability of respondents to claim financial inability to pay administrative penalties and penalty installment plans.</p>
2006-018-019-PR	<p>Electronic Reporting The EPA CROMERR rule was promulgated on October 13, 2005. This rule modifies the TCEQ's authorized programs by requiring specific regulatory changes in those programs in order for the agency to accept reports and applications electronically.</p>
2006-041-030-CE	<p>Occupational Licensing Rulemaking would modify provisions to allow for the approval of training providers who offer training and certification of Visible Emissions Evaluators; establish fees for reviewing and processing applications received for approval of training material; address requirements for web based testing of applicants for licenses; address renewal requirements for individuals on active military duty; increase the current licensing fee; change the validity period of two-year licenses to three years; reduce the continuing education unit (CEU) requirements for Customer Service Inspectors; remove collection or transportation of municipal solid waste (MSW) from Chapter 30; outline what level of MSW license will be required</p>

	to operate specific types of MSW facilities; add a transitional period to eliminate provisional licenses or supervisor-in-training letters or put restrictions on the duties the individuals holding those licenses or letters can perform; and remove the definition of process control duties and transfer it to 30 TAC Chapter 290, Public Drinking Water
